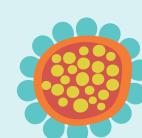

Science Fair in the Upper Elementary

Science fair is a corner where learners of grade levels 4 to 6 will have the opportunity to release the little scientist dormant inside each of them. It is one of the best experiences our learners can undertake to enhance and improve their inquiry and investigational skills. Of course, learning about science is at the heart of a science fair project. Our society relies more on science every day, and science fairs are a great way for learners to become more knowledgeable about how the world around them works. Every citizen needs sufficient science literacy to make educated decisions about what he or she reads in the media, about health care, and about other every-day problems.



Conceptually, a science fair project is very straightforward. A learner chooses a scientific question he or she would like to answer. Then, using different resources, the learner formulates a hypothesis and designs an experiment. 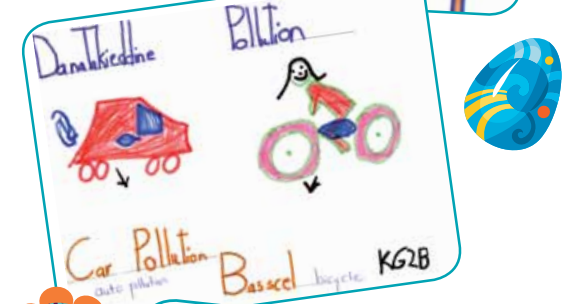

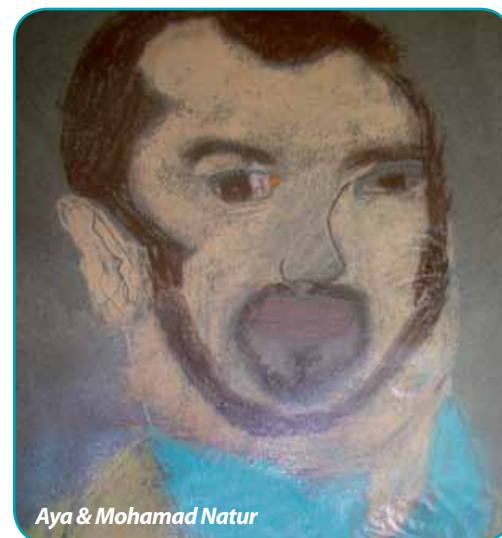

Fables

Une fable est un court récit écrit plutôt en vers qu'en prose et ayant un but didactique (qui comporte un enseignement, qui cherche donc à instruire). Elle se caractérise généralement par l'usage d'une symbolique animale ou avec des personnages fictifs, des dialogues vifs, et des ressorts comiques. La morale est soit à extraire de l'implicite du texte, soit exprimée à la fin ou, plus rarement, au début du texte. Les fables les plus caractéristiques comportent un double renversement des positions tenues par les personnages principaux. La fable s'inscrit dans le genre de l'apologue.

Jean de La Fontaine devient au XVIIe siècle le plus grand fabuliste de tous les temps. S'inspirant beaucoup d'Ésope, de Phèdre ou de Guéroult, il imprime sa marque en critiquant la société du siècle de Louis XIV. Ayant écrit plus de cinq cents fables, c'est un auteur prolifique, qui a marqué à jamais la littérature française.

Ses fables nous enseignent par exemple que :

«La raison du plus fort est toujours la meilleure» Le Loup et l'Agneau (I, 10), ou bien «En toute chose il faut considérer la fin» Le Renard et le Bouc (III, 5). Mais aussi que «Toute puissance est faible, à moins que d'être unie» Le Vieillard et ses enfants (IV, 19), et que «Rien ne

sert de courir, il faut partir à point» Le Lièvre et la Tortue (VI, 10) et beaucoup d'autres encore.

A SMOC, nos chers petits apprenants des G3, sont devenus à leur tour des «Petits La Fontaine» et ont créé leurs propres fables ! Ils y ont mis en œuvre les valeurs déjà discutées à l'école et en ont énoncé la morale à travers l'écriture d'une histoire adaptée à leur âge !

Il y a : des poules, des coqs, des cochons et deux vaches. Une des vaches, la plus jeune, procure du lait très frais, délicieux et écrémé.

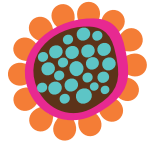

صفحة غيرت التاريخ

كانت فرنسا أثناء أزمته أيام الثورة الفرنسية قد انتشرت القمح من الجزائر بديون مؤجلة. إلا أنها لم تف بوعودها بتسديد ديونها. ولم تستمع إلى مطالب الجزائريين. وفي عام 1811م جاء القنصل الفرنسي لقصر الداي للتهنئة بمناسبة عيد الفطر. فسأله الداي عن رد الملك الفرنسي على رسالته فأساء القنصل الأدب في رده للداي. فما كان من الأخير إلا أن صفعه وطرده من القصر. فكتب القنصل إلى حكومته ما تم. فاعتبرت ذلك إهانة وأخذت تستعد للغزو.

أكملت فرنسا استعداداتها فأرسلت في 25 أيار 1830م حملة عسكرية ضخمة مؤلفة من 103 سفينة عسكرية وأربعمئة سفينة نقل تحمل العتاد وأربعين ألف مقاتل. ونزلت هذه القوة على البر واحتلت موقع (سيدي فرج).

وبعد معركة طاحنة بين الطرفين انتصر الفرنسيون ودخلوا مدينة الجزائر في (5 تموز 1830م) واضطر الداي إلى الاستسلام. ثم استولى الفرنسيين على الجزائر بأكملها.
